Early on in Hope for the Future's history, Pastor Diane greeted with a punch, followed by the announcement "Hot Dog!" on a weekly basis during the Church Without Walls Ministry at Tompkins's Square Park. Marlene Bailey, aka, Hot Dog, was one of the hardest of hard cases. When sober Marlene

could be pleasant, but drunk was a violent ride. As impossible a candidate Hot Dog seemed, she showed up twice a week at the park for food a n d

whether she liked it or not, the Word. Seeds were sown, fed and watered weekly for twenty years. Some seeds take a long time to germinate.

Marlene is 52 years of age and legally blind in one eye. She is the youngest of fourteen children brought up by alcoholic parents, her mother being the worse of the two. The household was divided like Noah's Ark, in pairs of children. Marlene's family partner was her older sister,

Patricia. They lost contact when Patricia went off to college in 1971. In 1974 Marlene's mother died at the funeral. She was already a heavily active alcoholic, following the family tree. From that time, Patricia prayed and sought to find Marlene.

Diane physically, but Hot Dog kept coming and Pastor kept on preaching and praying for the Flock at the park. Around the end of May, Pastor Diane began to feel a Holy Spirit burden for Hot Dog, so much so, that she began seeking her out on the Monday Outreach, which is in midtown. One Monday it was teeming rain

earlier in the evening. After the team finished the midtown outreach, Pastor Diane was led to seek out Hot Dog on E 7<sup>th</sup> St.

Ironically, Patricia became a missionary and is a very active participant in another ministry in the Bronx. For over 30 years she prayed that she would find her little sister, and find her still alive. And just to think, at the very same time, God was working out the answer to those prayers through Hope for the Future, one borough away.

Marlene wasn't particularly receptive to the Salvation Message and over the twenty years often slammed Pastor

and Ave A. The Lord was definitely bringing them closer. All violence had ceased and a friendship had developed, so much so that Pastor Diane gave her own sweatshirt to Hot Dog. It was gratefully received. Pastor Diane began to pray for a "key" to unlock the chains that kept Hot Dog bound in alcoholism.

One Monday Hot dog's sister-in-law Anna saw Marlene on 14<sup>th</sup> St. and called her older sister Dagma, in Florida.

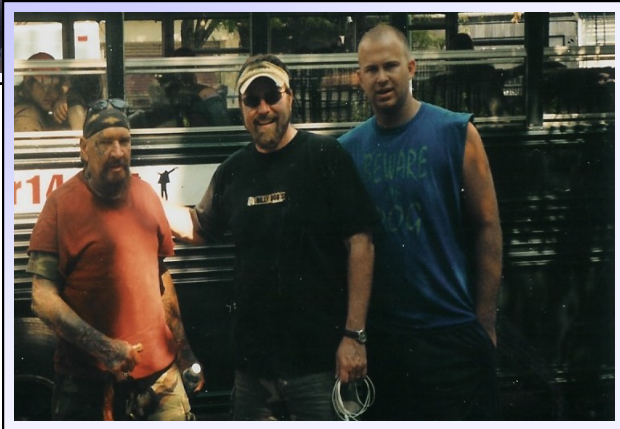

Dagma immediately called Patricia at her job in Manhattan and on her lunch hour, Patricia found Marlene, aka, Hot Dog, on her bench at Tompkins's Square park. They began to talk and Patricia told Marlene about an upcoming family reunion in Florida. Marlene wanted so to be connected to her family, her son and her grandchildren but it was decided that Marlene was in no condition to make the trip. The sister's spent time reminiscing about growing up downtown, and visited all the places of their youth; where they went to school, shopping, swimming, and the playground they whiled away the hours. The following Saturday, Marlene introduced Her sister Pat to pastor Diane on the Line at the Saturday outreach.

Dagma sent Pastor Diane photographs of the family and among them were those of Marlene's children, which had been removed from her decades earlier,

and those of her grandchildren. Pastor shared them with Marlene a few times a week, but kept them for safe keeping. The years of prayer, seeds from the



Christian rehab center in New York, which will remain anonymous. Twenty years of love, prayer, faith and obedience have worked together to set the captive free! We are doing our best to support her in every way possible. Please keep Marlene in your prayers for the long, difficult journey she has ahead. Amen! Ω
